DCM Report

- 1. 2022 Winter Committee Meeting:
 - 2022 Area 51 Winter Committee Meeting was held this past weekend. Got there on Saturday! Meetings on Saturday concluded at 11 PM ET, picked back up again at 8 AM on Sunday and concluded at noon ET.
 - Broke up into groups to discuss agenda items going up to the General Services Office (GSO) in New York, New York. We will discuss these items this evening.
 - We were able to interact and work with our North Carolina Delegate, so NC will be represented well!

- Two (2) motions sent to the Committee meeting. What the Committee meeting does is sets the agenda for the Assembly meeting(s).
 - Motion #1 Allow the Delegate to attend as many preconference's as necessary. Previously, the Delegate was limited to attending only three (3) annually. This motion **PASSED**!
 - Motion #2 Empower the Area Chairperson to translate Area related documents, e.g., minutes, etc., to Spanish. Motion **DID NOT PASS!** Alternatively, if anybody knows of anyone who is bilingual (fluent Spanish and English) and interested in providing document translation, please reach out to Craig immediately.

Old Business

- 1. Ad Hoc Picnic Committee:
 - All in attendance agreed to table the election of a committee until next month.
- 2. Ad Hoc Workshop Committee:
 - All in attendance agreed to table the election of a committee until next month.
 - Michael Riggs When are we going to have the picnic?
 - Craig More than likely in September. We can begin to organize the event beginning in April once we form the committee, and we have plenty of time to do so.

New Business

- 1. Preconference Planning:
 - a. Lots of discussion about communications at the Committee meetings.
 - i. In recent times, proposed changes that weren't effectively communicated to our groups.
 - ii. Our area holds several preconference's and events to discuss these changes, e.g., A.A. Preamble.
 - iii. GSO failed with effective communications and necessary participants failed to appropriately participate when needed.
 - iv. We need to make sure our voices, and the voices of our groups, are heard!
 - v. The preconference provides an opportunity to share with the Area 51 Delegate our Group Conscience and opinions. If the groups have inputs, we need to share those inputs at the preconference's.
 - 1. Matt M., a lot of home group members don't attend our business meetings, which adds to the problem.
 - vi. Craig, how do we get this information to the home group members?
 - 1. General discussion we should use home group business meetings to communicate and disseminate this information and to receive input from our home groups.
 - b. The Area 51 East Region preconference will be held on April 9, 2022 District 34 is part of the East Region. The East Region preconference will be held in Williamston, NC., please see below for address and details. There is a flyer available on the district 34 website.

- c. GSR's are strongly encouraged to attend the preconference.
- d. The Central Region preconference will be on March 26; Western Region preconference will be April 2 and the Spanish preconference is scheduled for April 10.
- e. There are three (3) Spanish speaking districts with North Carolina that overlay Area 51 (North Carolina).
- f. Brie and Craig participated in the literature committee during last weekend's Committee meetings. Each group will be assigned a certain agenda item during the preconference.
- g. At preconference we'll be divided into groups. There are a number of items the Delegate for NC needs input on from District 34 Groups. These are the items highlighted by the Delegate and distributed by Craig to District 34 GSR's.
- h. There will be a virtual event where we can speak with the Area Delegate directly.
- i. Agenda Item K Edition 4 of the book Alcoholics Anonymous, also known as, the Big Book, is slated to be translated into a simpler form of English from a verbiage, language, and grammatical perspective. The current version of the Big Book, examined by Subject Matter Experts in the field, has been determined to be written at a ninth-grade level. The proposed revision to the 4th edition would produce a sixth-grade grade level version of the Big Book. The revised version would not replace the current 4th edition. It would be made available in addition to the current version of the 4th edition. The purpose for this changes is to make the Big Book more accessible to readers who may not have the ability to comprehend, entirely, the current version of the 4th edition.
 - i. Added Comments: The proposed revisions to edition 4 of the book, Alcoholics Anonymous, also known as, the Big Book, does not impact plans for the new 5th edition.
- j. Action items and take-aways to discuss with our home groups at your next business meeting:
 - i. Read the preconference agenda items and discuss.
 - ii. Discuss items you think your home group will want to discuss and get their conscience.
 - iii. Socialize and discuss with your groups the revisions to the 4th edition of the Big Book noted above.
 - 1. Provide your groups inputs to the Area 51 Delegate during the upcoming virtual meeting(s) and/or at the regional preconference in April.
 - iv. Discuss the 5 pages of highlighted and prioritized items from the Area 51 Delegate.
 - 1. Provide your groups feedback to the Area 51 Delegate during the upcoming virtual meeting(s) with the Delegate and/or at the regional preconference in April.

- v. Provide your home group members with the means of communicating its conscience to the Area 51 Delegate. We are the voice of our home groups!
- vi. Make sure you give people access to the background information.

2. Area 51 Inventory

- a. This item will be a key agenda item at the Area Assembly in June.
 - i. How well do we (Area 51) serve alcoholics in North Carolina?
 - ii. How can we reach out better?
- b. The inventory is open to anybody in A.A. If you go to the Area 51 Website, you can pull down a copy of the inventory. The inventory is located under the "Secure Section" of the website. The userid is 34 and password is notglumlot.
 - i. Matt M. Is this something we can bring back to our groups to discuss?
 - 1. Craig, you can, or we can do this individually too. You can fill out the questionnaire as a GSR, home group member, or as a home group collectively.
- c. There are 9 questions on the website. We do this every few years to make sure we're staying honest and on path to make sure the hand of A.A. is always there for the individual that needs it.
